Mel Noland Natural Resources Careers Camp (NRCC) Memorial Scholarship \$1,000 per year

Requirements:

- Full or part-time students entering as 2nd semester freshman, sophomores, juniors, or seniors
- Must be a U.S. citizen/permanent resident
- Must have at least a 2.0 GPA at college
- Declared or intended major in forestry, natural resources, environment, land management, wildlife, fisheries or related fields
- Shows a sincere interest in and understanding of natural resources management
- Letter of recommendation from teacher or counselor of attending college
- Successful completion of the NRCC summer program required

Southern Maryland Resource, Conservation and Development Scholarship – Southern Maryland Residency

\$500 per year

Requirements:

- Full or part-time students at the undergraduate or graduate level
- Must be a U.S. citizen/permanent resident with <u>required</u> residence in Southern Maryland (Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, Prince George's and St. Mary's counties)
- Must have at least a 2.5 GPA at undergraduate level or 3.0 GPA at graduate level
- Declared or intended major in environmental or natural sciences, such as forestry, wildlife and fisheries management, land management, coastal marine conservation, wetland conservation, or related fields
- Letter of recommendation from a mentor, teacher or counselor of attending college

Southern Maryland Resource, Conservation and Development Scholarship – Maryland Residency
